Students will be expanding on the language components of listening, speaking, reading and writing that they acquired in their first year of Spanish. The students will be introduced to short stories and songs from Hispanic literature as well as cultural Internet sites that display current events from Spanish speaking countries. As communication is the basis for all language, everyone will be required to speak

Spanish during class time. These will all be tools that students can use in the future, whether it is in a future Spanish class, future travel or the community.

General Classroom Expectations/information

- ◆ Please remember to be respectful and kind to classmates and teachers. Each student has a right to educational attention. Please respect your classmates and the teacher by being prepared and participative.
- ◆ Remember communication is key; if you experience a problem or challenge, talk with teacher, look for solutions before issues become problems.
- ◆ Remove gum before class. Part of your grade is based on speaking and pronunciation of the language, gum deters from this. You will be given 10 minutes of detention immediately after class. Do not eat in the classroom. Also, limit your drinks to water in the classroom.
- ◆ Your iPad is required to be brought to every class fully charged. Points will be awarded at the end of each grading period for participation.
- ◆ Speak in Spanish, avoid English as much as possible, use of language is the only way to learn it. If you are unsure of something being said, look around, observe what is happening, use deduction to participate and endeavor to understand.
- ◆ The PHS Discipline Plan will be followed in dealing with student conduct.
- ◆ Any use of phone and ear buds etc. is prohibited during class time unless permitted for a specific activity, otherwise these items will be taken to the office.
- ◆ Cell phones should be turned off and kept out of sight during class time; friends and relatives should be reminded it is not appropriate to text or phone during class time. In case of an emergency they should contact the office.
- ◆ Upon arriving tardy, a tardy will be marked on the role sheet and student will receive a detention that will be served after school.
- ◆ Cheating in any form is completely unacceptable. Zeros will be recorded in grade book and a referral will be issued. This includes any outside work done with an online translator and copying or sharing of work. Cheating is turning in anything that is 100% not your work.
- ◆ Mandatory tutorials: when a student's grade drops below 70% he/she will be required to work at tutorial in F1, this will be directed by teacher; he/she may be asked to work alone, with a partner/group, or teacher until the grade is above 70%.

Absences

If you are absent, your work (assignment, project, paper) is due at the beginning of class upon your return. If the assignment is to be turned via the Internet, it is due on the original date. Any tests/quizzes that were given during the absence must be made up at the beginning of the class period upon your return. If you are absent on Monday, on Wednesday you must turn in

homework that was due on Monday as well as what is due on Wednesday. If you miss more than one class period in a row, makeup work will be discussed. Those students with an excused absence may obtain full credit for making up their work. In the event of unexcused absences, work will be eligible for half credit only. You should have a

permanent “compañero/a” (classmate) for the year to obtain worksheets and any other information that was given in your absence. If you have an unexcused absence or suspension, any work due on that (those) school day(s) is due at the beginning of class upon your return. This work is eligible for

Homework

Homework is due at the beginning of class otherwise it is considered late. **Late homework is not accepted.** Homework must be fully completed in order to receive credit. One or two items left blank due to questions you may have regarding the homework is okay, an entire exercise left blank does not constitute completion. Also, if an assignment requires a minimum amount of words to be written, it needs to have at least that to earn credit.

Homework, projects, and test/quiz announcements will be posted on Google Classroom, but you should not rely solely on this posting, check in with your “compañero/a” and teacher.

Late work

Assignments and projects are due at the beginning of class other wise they are considered late. Assignments other than homework received past the beginning of class on the due date will be eligible for half credit until the beginning of the next class. For example, if a project/”cuaderno” is due on Monday, October 12th, you have until Wednesday, October 14th at the beginning of class to turn it in. Beyond that date and time, no credit is available for that assignment. Any technological excuses will not be honored (i.e. “My computer/printer wasn’t working.”).
